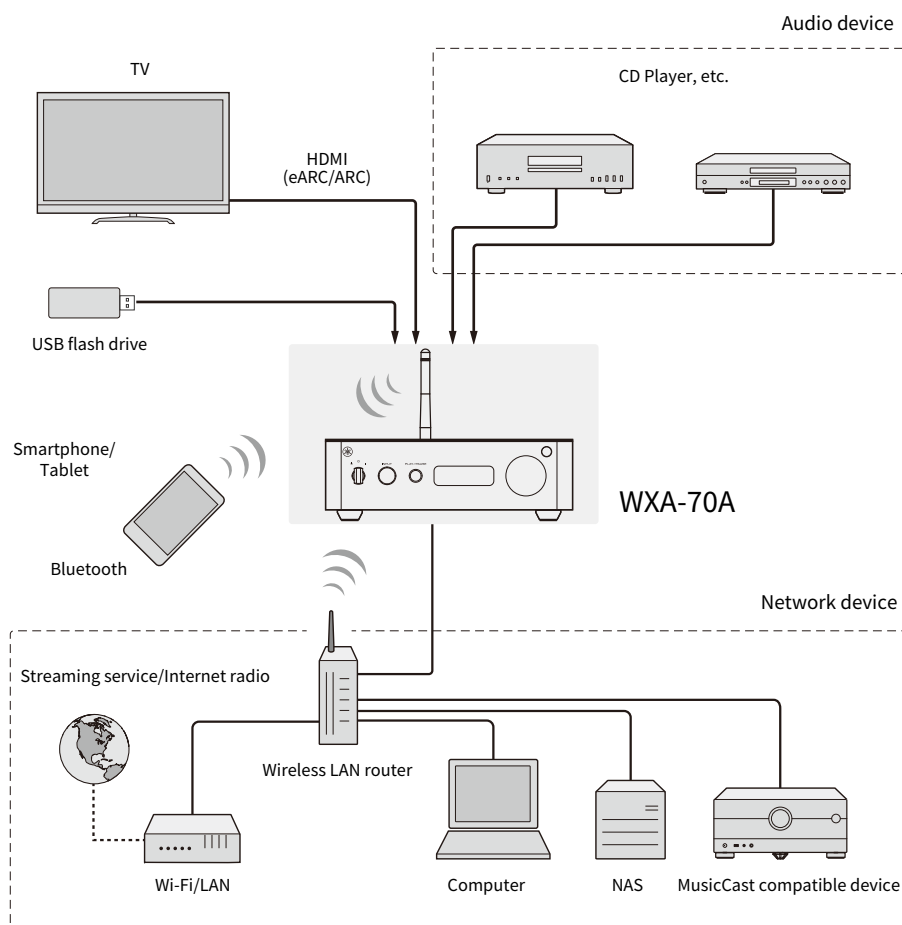
Features of this product

 - Do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.
 - Lower the volume temporarily before switching input sources.
 - Avoid sudden increases in volume.
When operating the product from a smartphone or tablet, the volume may change suddenly. Adjust the volume carefully.

Prepare the supplied remote control for use.

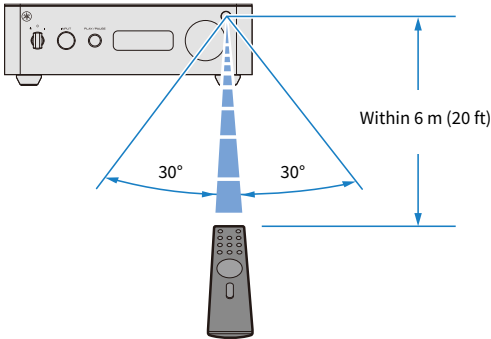
Inserting the batteries

Put the supplied batteries into the remote control facing the correct way (+/-).



Using the remote control

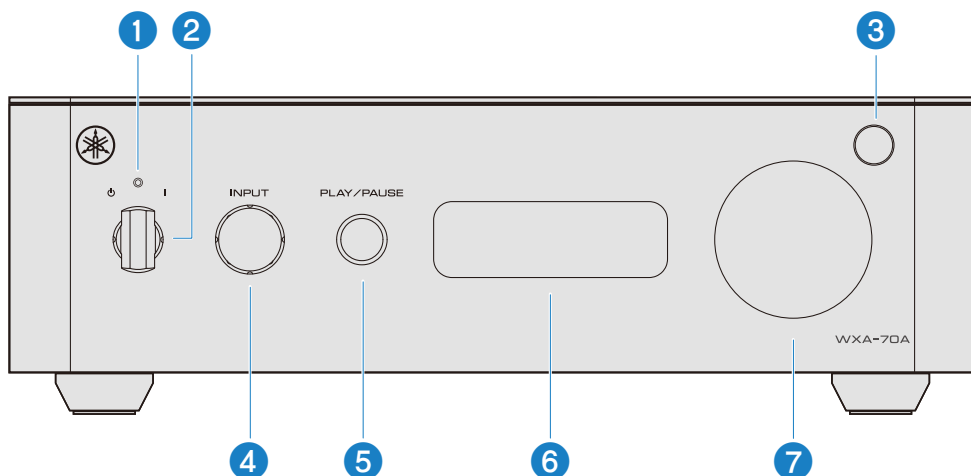
The supplied remote control operates using an infrared signal. Its effective operating range is shown in the illustration below.



NAMES OF PARTS AND THEIR FUNCTIONS

Front panel

The following are the names of parts of the front panel and an explanation of their functions.



1 Power indicator

Lights white when the power is turned on.

If the indicator flashes, the power will no longer turn on in order to protect the product. For more details, refer to the following section.

“Problems with power, system, and/or remote control” (p.63)

2 Power switch

Turn the switch clockwise and align it with the [|] position to turn the power on. Turn the switch counterclockwise and align it with the [⏻] position to turn the power off (standby) (p.35).

When you release your hand, the switch automatically returns to the center position.

3 Remote control signal receiver

Receives the infrared signals from the remote control (p.10).

4 [INPUT] Input source selector knob

Turn clockwise or counterclockwise to select the input source (p.37).

5 [PLAY/PAUSE] Playback control button

Plays or pauses content.

6 Information display

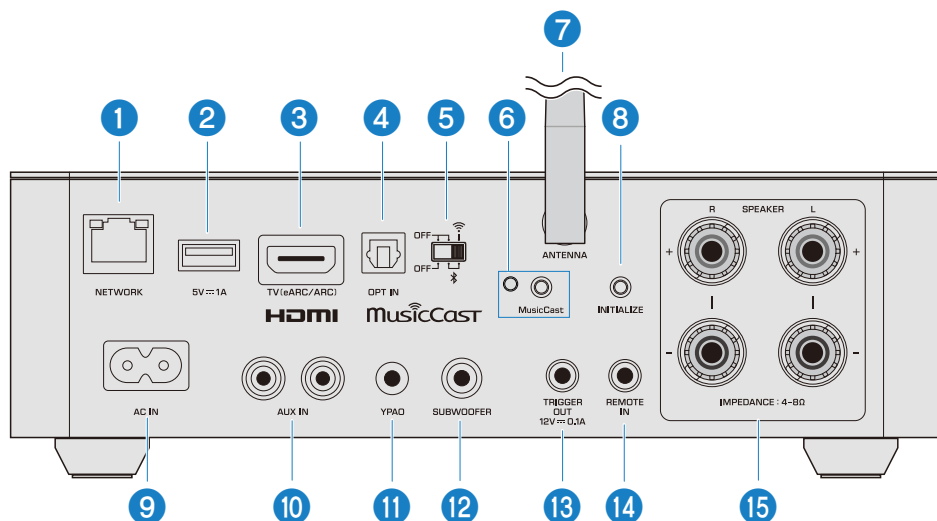
Displays various information (p.15).

7 Volume knob

Turn clockwise or counterclockwise to adjust the volume (p.39).

Rear panel

The following are the names of parts of the rear panel and an explanation of their functions.



1 [NETWORK] jack

For connecting a network cable when connecting this product to a wired network (p.26).

2 USB jack

For connecting a USB flash drive (p.45).

3 [TV(eARC/ARC)] jack

For connecting to a TV using a commercially-available HDMI cable (p.22).

4 [OPT IN] jack

For connecting to external devices with an optical digital output (p.24).

5 Wireless switch

Turns the wireless communication functions (wireless LAN and Bluetooth) on or off (p.26).

6 [MusicCast] indicator/button

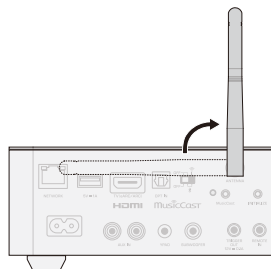
The left side in the figure is the indicator, and the right side is the button.

- The indicator flashes green while MusicCast network setup is in progress. It lights green when connected to the MusicCast network and when connected to a wired/wireless network.
- The button is used when registering this product on the MusicCast network (p.28). After launching the “MusicCast Controller” app, follow the app’s on-screen instructions.

7 Wireless antenna

Antenna for wireless LAN and Bluetooth (p.26).

If the wireless connection is unstable, raising the antenna may improve it.



NOTICE

- Do not apply excessive force to the wireless antenna. Doing so may damage it.
- Do not remove the wireless antenna.

8 [INITIALIZE] button

Used to initialize the product (restore factory default settings) (p.59).

9 [AC IN] jack

For connecting the supplied power cord (p.27).

10 [AUX IN] jack

For connecting to an audio device with analog audio output (p.24).

11 [YPAO] microphone jack

For connecting the supplied YPAO microphone (p.31). Do not plug in commercially available microphones.

12 [SUBWOOFER] output jack

For connecting to a subwoofer with a built-in amplifier (p.21).

13 [TRIGGER OUT] jack

For connecting to an external device that supports the trigger function, such as a Yamaha subwoofer (p.21).

14 [REMOTE IN] jack

If an infrared receiver is connected to this jack, you can operate this product with the supplied remote control even when it is stored out of sight (p.25).

15 [SPEAKER] terminal

For connecting to speakers (p.19).

Information display

This section explains the information shown on the information display on the front panel.

Basic display

Input source indicator

Shows the input source when the source is switched.
Example of display when the input source is switched to “TV”



Volume indicator

Shows the volume level when the volume is adjusted.
Example of display when the volume level is set to 50



Startup indicator

Shows when this product is being started up. While this is displayed, no operations other than power off (standby) are available.

MusicCast setup indicator

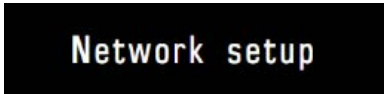
Displayed when the [MusicCast] button is pressed and held. It indicates that the product is ready for initial setup from the “MusicCast Controller”.
Display example



Network setup indicator

Displayed when the product is turned on after initialization. It indicates that the product is ready for initial setup from “MusicCast Controller” and Wi-Fi setup via WAC*.

Network setup

* WAC (Wireless Accessory Configuration) is a function that applies the wireless settings of an iOS device to another device for wireless network connection.

Other displays

If information about the content being played is available, the station name or track name is displayed.

NOTE

Characters that cannot be displayed are shown as “□”.

Brightness of the information display

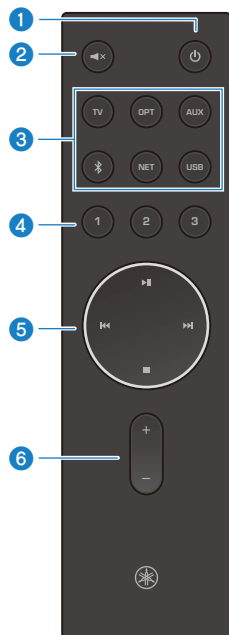
- To protect the display, the brightness is adjusted automatically as follows:
 - If no operation is performed for a certain amount of time, the display dims.
 - After dimming, if there is still no operation for a certain amount of time, the display turns off.
- After dimming or turning off, performing any operation restores the display to its normal brightness.
- You can change the information display brightness and the time until the display turns off in the setup menu.

Remote control

The following are the names of the parts of the included remote control and explanations of their functions.



1 [⏻] Power key

Turns the product on or off (standby mode) (p.35).

2 [🔇] Mute key

Mutes the sound. Pressing it again returns the volume to its original level (p.39).

3 Input source selection keys

Selects the input source to play (p.37).

NOTE

The [NET] key cycles through network sources in sequence each time it is pressed.

4 [1] [2] [3] keys

Used to register and recall your favorite Internet radio stations and network content (p.54).

5 Playback control keys

[▶||] Toggles between play and pause.

[◀◀] Goes to the beginning of the current track or to the previous track.

When the input source is set to “Server” or “USB”, press and hold for more than 2 seconds to fast-reverse.

[▶▶] Skips to the next track.

When the input source is set to “Server” or “USB”, press and hold for more than 2 seconds to fast-forward.

[■] Stops playback.

6 [+] [-] keys

Adjusts the volume. Pressing [+] increases the volume, and pressing [-] decreases the volume (p.39).

CONNECTIONS

Connecting speakers

Connect speakers (L, R) to this product.

Required cables

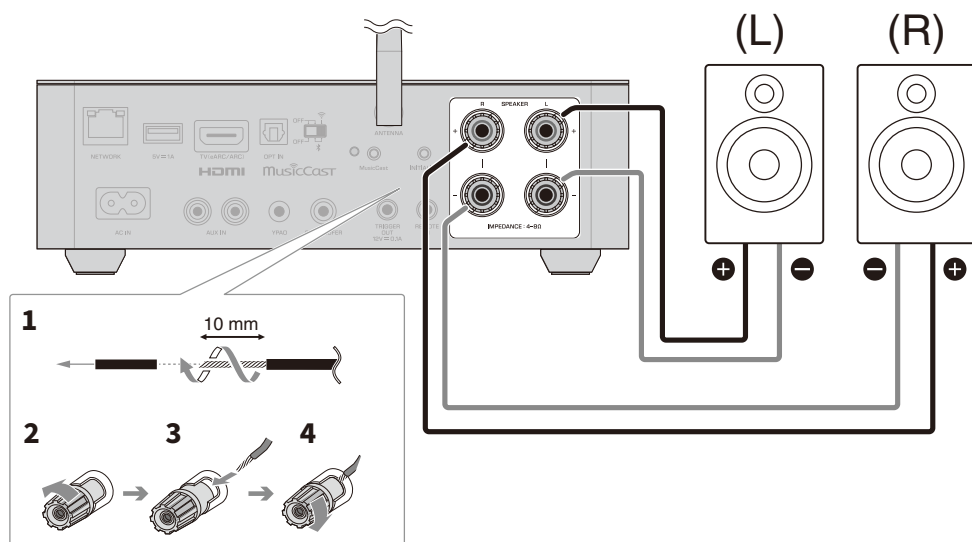
Obtain commercially-available speaker cables.

Speaker impedance

Use speakers with an impedance of 4 Ω or higher.

Connection method

Use the speaker cables to connect the L (left) speaker to the [SPEAKER] [L] terminal and the R (right) speaker to the [SPEAKER] [R] terminal.



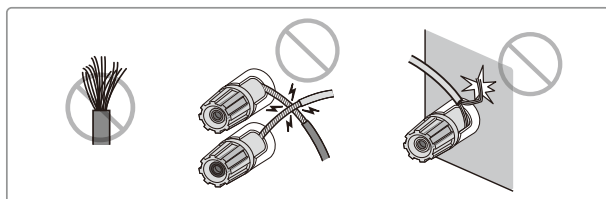
- 1** Strip approximately 10 mm of insulation from the end of the speaker cable, and twist the exposed wire strands tightly together.
- 2** Turn the speaker terminal knob counterclockwise to loosen it.
- 3** Insert the exposed wire of the speaker cable into the hole in the terminal.

4 Turn the terminal clockwise to tighten it.

This completes the speaker connections.

NOTICE

- When preparing speaker cables, do so at a location away from this product. Otherwise, if an exposed wire enters the inside of this product, it may cause a short circuit or other malfunction.
- Do not allow the exposed wire of the speaker cable to come into contact with the exposed wire of another speaker cable or with any metal part of this product. Otherwise, this may cause this product or the speakers to malfunction.

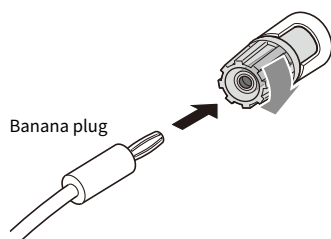


■ Connecting with banana plugs

Model For

U.S.A. and Canada

When using banana plugs, tighten the speaker terminal knobs firmly, and then insert the banana plugs into the terminals.



Connecting a subwoofer

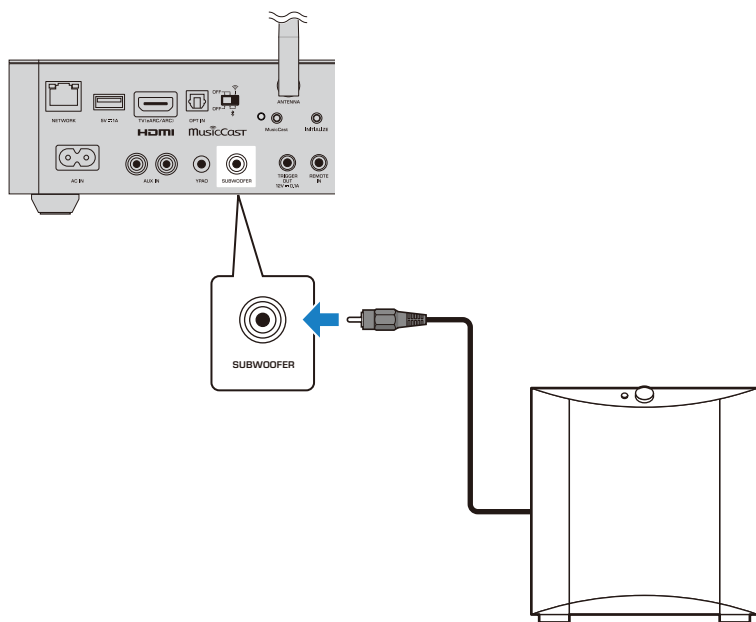
You can connect an active subwoofer (with built-in amplifier) to this product. Using a subwoofer allows you to enjoy more powerful and dynamic low-frequency sound.

Required cables

Obtain a commercially-available monaural pin cable (RCA) or one supplied with the subwoofer.

Connection method

Use a monaural pin cable (RCA) to connect the subwoofer to the [SUBWOOFER] jack on this product.



NOTE

Yamaha subwoofers that support system connections can be synchronized to the power on/off of this product using the trigger function. Use a commercially available 3.5 mm monaural mini-plug cable to connect the [TRIGGER OUT] jack of this product to the subwoofer. The subwoofer power then turns on/off in conjunction with this product being turned on or placed in standby. For more details, refer to the user's manual of the subwoofer.

Connecting a TV

You can connect a TV that supports eARC/ARC to this product. This allows you to play the TV’s audio through the speakers of this product. You can also link the power of the TV and this product for synchronized on/off control.

Required cables

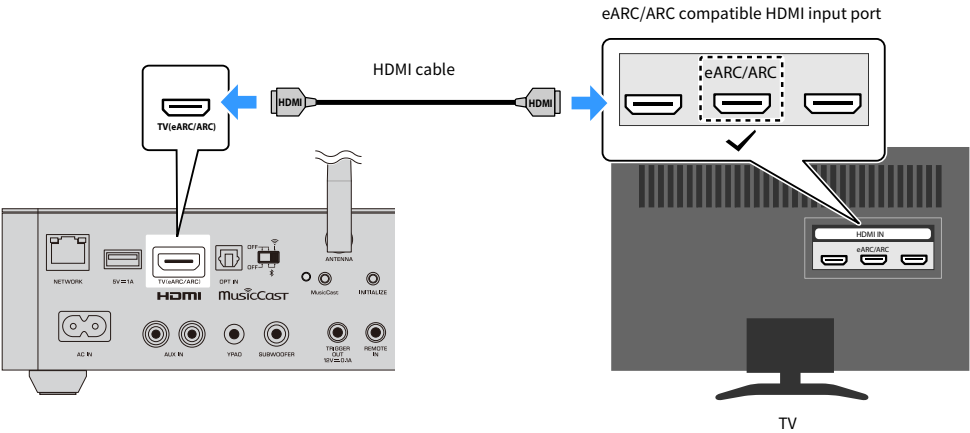
Obtain a commercially-available HDMI cable (19-pin).

About HDMI cables

- Select one of the following commercially available HDMI cables (HDMI-certified).
 - High Speed HDMI Cable with Ethernet
 - Premium High Speed HDMI Cable with Ethernet
 - Ultra High Speed HDMI Cable
 - Ultra96 HDMI Cable

Connection method

Use the HDMI cable to connect the [TV(eARC/ARC)] jack on this product to the TV’s HDMI input jack.



NOTE

- Connect to an HDMI input jack on the TV labeled with either “eARC/ARC” or “ARC”.
- Only 2-channel PCM audio signals can be played on this product through the [TV(eARC/ARC)] jack.
- If the TV does not have an HDMI jack labeled “eARC/ARC” or “ARC”, use an optical digital connection or analog connection. “Connecting an audio device” (p.24)

About the TV’s HDMI jacks

Depending on the HDMI jack on the TV, settings on the TV side may be required. For details, refer to the following table and the user’s manual for the TV.

TV HDMI jack		Required TV settings and other details
	If you connect this product to an HDMI jack that is labeled “eARC/ARC”, ensure that the settings of the TV are as follows:	• Set the TV’s audio output destination to an external device (this product), not the TV’s internal speakers. • Set eARC to On, if the setting is available. • Set HDMI Control to On if you want to synchronize the power on/off operation of this product and the TV. • Set the audio format output via eARC/ARC to 2-channel PCM.
	If you connect this product to an HDMI jack that is only labeled “ARC”, configure the following settings on the TV.	• Set the TV’s audio output destination to an external device (this product), not the TV’s internal speakers. • Set HDMI Control to On. • Set the audio format output via ARC to 2-channel PCM.
	If you connect this product to an HDMI jack without “eARC/ARC” or “ARC” labeling, TV audio cannot be played back through this product. Connect to an HDMI jack labeled “eARC/ARC” or “ARC”. Alternatively, use an optical digital connection or analog connection instead. “Connecting an audio device” (p.24)	

Connecting an audio device

This explains how to connect an audio device to the product. Two types of connections are available: optical digital or analog.

Required cables

For optical digital connection

Obtain a commercially-available optical digital cable.

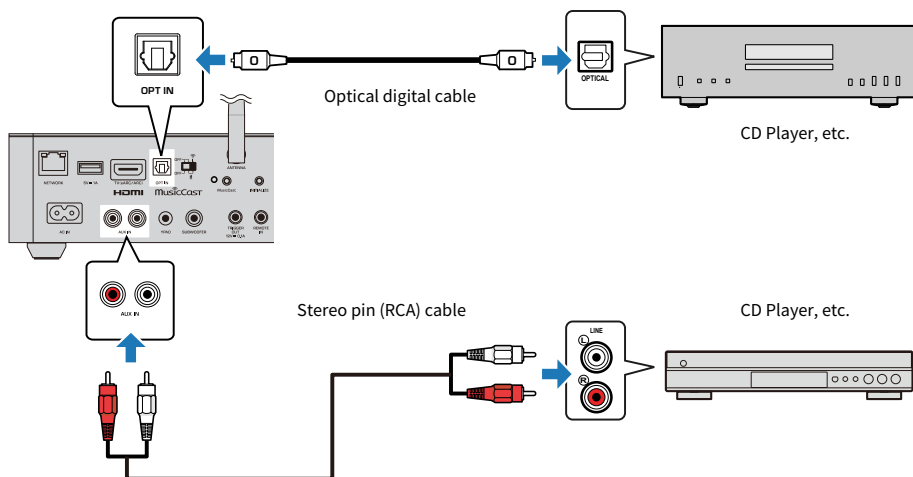
For analog connection

Obtain a commercially-available stereo pin cable (RCA).

Connection method

For a digital connection, use an optical digital cable to connect the audio device to the [OPT IN] jack on this product.

For an analog connection, use a stereo pin cable (RCA) to connect the audio device to the [AUX IN] jack on this product.



Connecting an infrared receiver (remote connection)

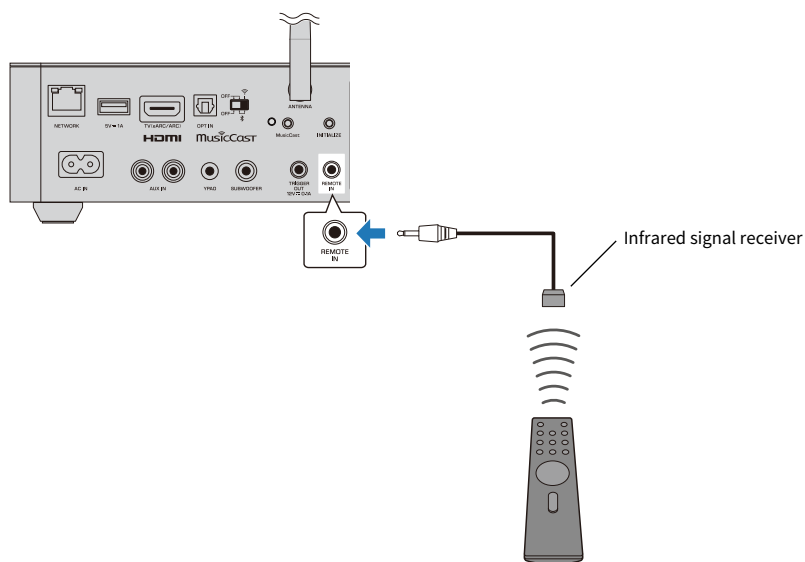
By connecting a commercially available infrared receiver to the [REMOTE IN] jack of this product, you can operate this product with the remote control even when it is installed in a location where the remote control signal cannot reach it.

Required device and cable

Obtain a commercially-available infrared receiver and a cable for connecting the device. The [REMOTE IN] jack of this product supports a 3.5 mm monaural mini plug.

Connection method

Connect the infrared receiver to the [REMOTE IN] jack of this product.



Connecting to a network

This product supports both wireless and wired network connections. Select the connection method suiting your network environment.

■ Connection method

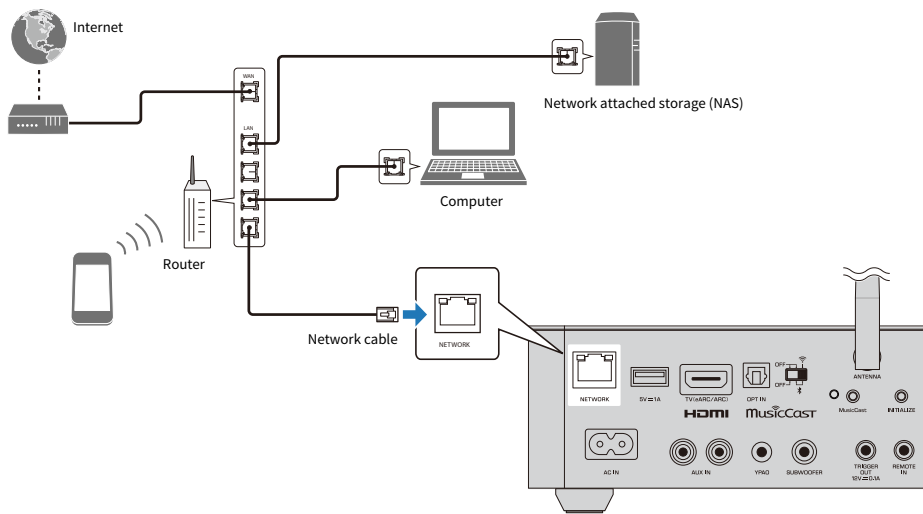
Wireless network connection

When using a wireless connection, setup is performed using the “MusicCast Controller” app, so no prior preparation is required. For more details, refer to the following section.

“Setting up MusicCast” (p.28)

Wired network connection

To make a wired connection, use a commercially available network cable to connect this product to your router. Connect the network cable to the [NETWORK] jack on this product.



NOTICE

- Do not connect this product to a public Wi-Fi and/or Internet service directly. Only connect this product to the Internet through a router with strong password protections. Consult your router manufacturer for information on optimum security practices.

NOTE

To prevent electromagnetic interference, use an STP (Shielded Twisted Pair) cable of Category 5e (CAT5e) or higher with a straight configuration for the network cable.

Connecting the power cord

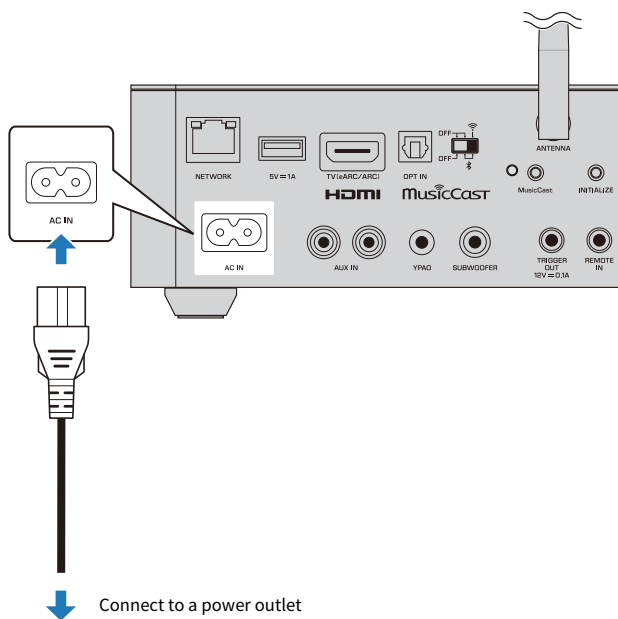
After completing all device connections, connect the included power cord.

Required cables

Use the included power cord.

Connection method

Connect the power cord to the [AC IN] jack on this product, and then plug the power plug into an AC outlet.



INSTALLING AND SETTING UP THE APP

Setting up MusicCast

Use the “MusicCast Controller” app to register this product to your MusicCast network.

At the same time, you can configure the wireless network connection of this product and perform automatic room calibration (YPAO). “MusicCast Controller” is a free application available for smartphones and tablets.

Required devices

- WXA-70A unit
 - Ensure the power cord is already connected.
- Smartphone or tablet
 - Must be connected to a wireless LAN router (access point).
 - Make sure that the Bluetooth function is turned on.

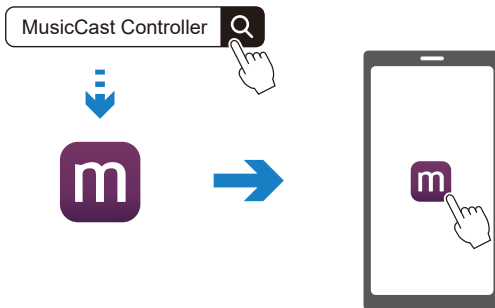
NOTE

Even if you are using a wired network connection, you must still complete this registration procedure for the MusicCast network. If the product is not registered to the MusicCast network, it cannot be operated using the “MusicCast Controller” app.

Setup procedure

1 Install the “MusicCast Controller” app on your smartphone or tablet.

To download the app, search for “MusicCast Controller” in the App Store or Google Play.



2 Launch the installed app.

3 Tap “Add New Device” to start setup.



4 Follow the on-screen instructions in the app to proceed with setup.

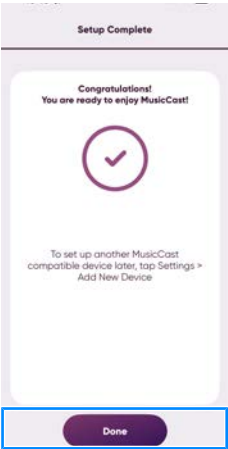
Operate the app and this product according to the instructions.

Operation tips

- Choose this product “WXA-70A” on the app’s device selection screen.
- If new firmware is available, a firmware update prompt will be displayed. Follow the instructions to perform the update (the update cannot be skipped).
- During setup, the following messages are shown on the information display. Continue setup by following the instructions in the app.
 - “Network Setup”: Indicates that this is the initial setup (including after initialization of this product).
 - “MusicCast Setup”: Indicates that MusicCast setup is in progress.

5 Confirm that setup is complete.

When setup is complete, a completion screen is displayed in the app.



Automatic adjustment of speaker settings (YPAO)

What is YPAO?

YPAO is Yamaha's proprietary automatic room calibration function. Using the supplied microphone, this function measures the acoustic characteristics of the room and automatically adjusts settings for the speaker distance and other parameters to achieve optimal sound quality.

YPAO can be executed using the "MusicCast Controller" app.

■ When YPAO is required

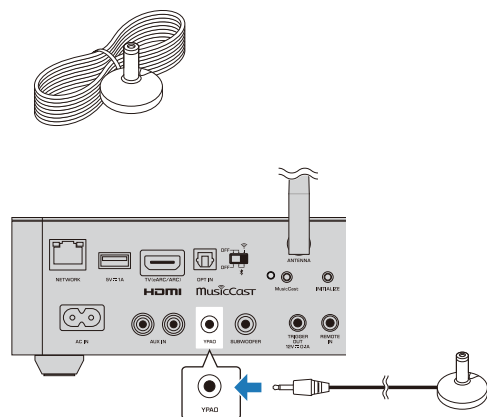
Run YPAO in the following situations:

- When setting up the speakers for the first time
- After the speaker positions have been changed
- After the listening position has been changed
- When a subwoofer is added or removed

■ Accessories used

To ensure a smooth and efficient setup for YPAO, prepare the following supplied accessories in advance.

YPAO microphone

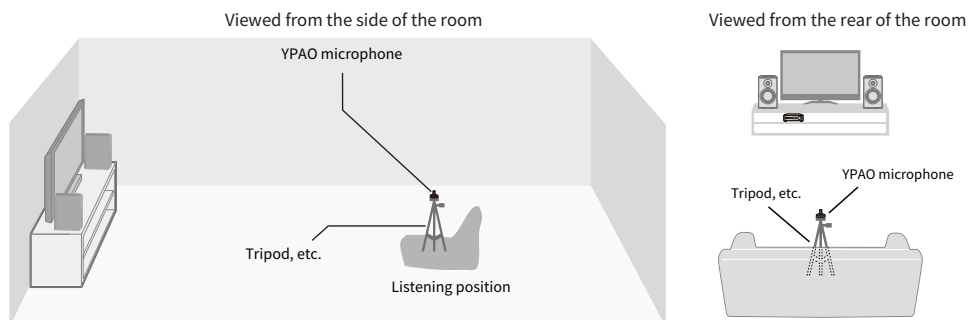


- Connect the YPAO microphone to the [YPAO] microphone jack on the rear panel.
- Connect it by following the instructions in the app. Do not connect it until instructed to do so.

■ Example of YPAO microphone placement

Refer to the diagram below for correct placement of the YPAO microphone in the room.

INSTALLING AND SETTING UP THE APP > Automatic adjustment of speaker settings (YPAO)



- Place the YPAO microphone at the listening position so that it is parallel to the floor.
- The YPAO microphone can also be attached to a camera tripod.

NOTICE

- After installation, be careful not to trip over the YPAO microphone cable. The microphone or cable may be damaged.

■ How do I start YPAO?

Operate using the “MusicCast Controller” app as follows:

- When installing the speakers in the room for the first time, tap “Add New Device” on the app’s startup screen and follow the on-screen instructions to complete the initial setup. YPAO is performed as part of the initial setup.
- If you change the speaker positions after initial setup or want to run YPAO again, select “Speakers & Room Calibration / Run YPAO” from the settings menu in the app.

Notes when running YPAO

- During YPAO measurement, a loud test tone will be emitted from the speakers. The volume level cannot be adjusted.
- To ensure proper adjustment, observe the following points while YPAO is running:
 - Do not make any loud noises.
 - Do not get in between the speakers and the YPAO microphone.
- Connect the YPAO microphone only when instructed to do so in the app.

■ After YPAO completion

After YPAO is completed, be sure to disconnect the YPAO microphone from the microphone jack.

Error and warning messages

When error or warning messages are displayed during YPAO measurement, resolve the cause based on the following table and perform measurement again.

Error type

Error No.	Error description
Code 005	Noise level is too loud. Keep the room quiet and retry YPAO. If you select “Proceed”, YPAO takes the measurement again and ignores any noise detected.
Code 008	Could not detect a measurement signal. Connect the microphone to the YPAO terminal firmly and retry YPAO.
Code 009	Measurement was canceled due to main unit operation.
Code 031	Speakers not detected. Press Quit, turn the unit off and make sure front left and right speakers are properly connected.
Code 051	Could not detect microphone. Make sure the microphone is properly connected to the YPAO terminal.
Code 101-199	An internal error has occurred. Exit YPAO, and turn off and on the unit.

Warning type

Even when a warning message is displayed, the measurement results can still be saved. However, to use the system with the optimal speaker settings, Yamaha recommends resolving the cause of the warning and running the measurement again.

Warning Messages	Warning description
Speaker may be placed more than 24 m (80 ft) from the microphone.	Adjust the speaker positions based on the YPAO measurement results.
Measurement results indicate significant differences in volume between the speakers.	Adjust the speaker positions based on the YPAO measurement results. Also, check that the subwoofer volume is set appropriately.
	Check the cable connection (+ and –) of the speakers.
	If they are connected incorrectly: Reconnect the speaker cables.
Speaker cable may be connected with reverse polarity (+/-).	If they are connected properly: Depending on the type of speakers and the installation environment, this message may be displayed even if they are connected correctly. Save the measurement results, and use the product as-is. This is a message to prompt the customer to check, but the product can be used in this state without any effect on playback.

Checking YPAO measurements and changing settings

You can check the YPAO measurements and change settings using the “MusicCast Controller” app. Operate the app from your smartphone or tablet where “MusicCast Controller” is installed.

■ Checking YPAO measurement results

- 1 Start “MusicCast Controller” on your mobile device(s), select the room in which this product is installed, and then tap the settings icon.**
- 2 Tap the room in which this product is installed from “Room Settings” on the Settings screen.**
- 3 Tap “Speaker Setup” under “Speakers & Room Calibration” on the room screen (this product).**
- 4 Check the YPAO measurement results.**

■ Setting item

In “Speaker Setup”, you can also change the settings for the items shown in the table below. For more details, refer to the app screen.

Setting item	Description
YPAO	Selects whether to apply the YPAO measurements to the speaker settings.
Subwoofer	Sets whether to use/not use subwoofer.
Front Speaker Frequency	Sets the frequency bandwidth output to the left/right speakers. If you select low frequency cut, the configured crossover frequency is applied. If a subwoofer will not be used, the setting cannot be made.
Subwoofer Frequency	Sets the speaker and subwoofer crossover frequencies. If a subwoofer will not be used, the setting cannot be made.
Distance	Sets the distance from the listening position to each speaker individually so the sound from each of them reaches you at the same time.
Level	Sets speakers individually so the volume from each sounds the same at the listening position.
EQ	Sets whether to use/not use an equalizer based on YPAO measurements.
YPAO Volume	When “YPAO Volume” is set to “On”, the balance between the bass and treble ranges is adjusted automatically in conjunction with the volume, which allows you to enjoy a natural sound quality balance, even at low volumes.

NOTE

If you will use a subwoofer, install it before running YPAO measurements to ensure a smooth connection between the bass and midrange sounds. If you feel the volume of the bass is too loud or low, adjust to the desired volume with “SW” under the “Level” item.

BASIC OPERATION

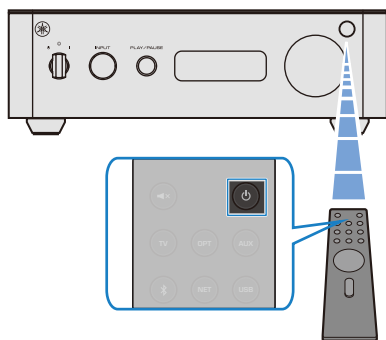
Turning the power on/off (Standby)

Turn the power on or off (standby) using the remote control or the power switch on the front panel.

■ Turning the power on/off

When using the remote control

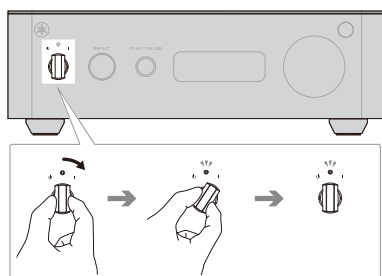
Point the remote control at this product, and press the [⏻] key to turn on the power.



To turn off (standby), press the [⏻] key again.

When using the power switch on the front panel

To turn the power on, turn the power switch clockwise, and align it with the [I] mark. When you release your hand, the switch automatically returns to the center position.



To turn the power off (standby), turn switch counter-clockwise, align it with the [⏻] mark, and then return it to the center position.

NOTE

When the power is on, the power indicator is lit white.

About the Auto Standby function

- If no operation or audio playback occurs for 20 minutes, the product will automatically switch off (standby).
- Approximately 30 seconds before turning off (standby), the information display shows a countdown indicating the remaining time.
Example display: "Auto standby: 30 sec" (30 seconds until standby)
- To extend the time before the product turns off (standby), perform an operation such as adjusting the volume or selecting an input source, or start audio playback.
- The Auto Standby function can be disabled (set to Off) by changing the setting.
 - "Settings overview" (p.56)

Selecting an input source

This section shows how to select the input source to play.



Press one of the input source selection keys on the remote control to choose the desired input source. The input source can also be selected by turning the [INPUT] input source selector knob on the front panel to the left or right.

Input source selection keys	Playback audio
[TV]	Audio from an eARC/ARC-compatible TV input via the [TV(eARC/ARC)] jack (HDMI)
[OPT]	Audio input via the [OPT IN] jack
[AUX]	Audio input via the [AUX IN] jack
[Bluetooth symbol]	Audio from a Bluetooth device connected to this product
[NET]	Audio from network content Various types of network content are available. Press the [NET] key repeatedly to cycle through and select the desired network content.
[USB]	Audio from music files stored on a USB flash drive

When an input source is selected, the input name appears on the information display.

Example of display when the input source is set to TV

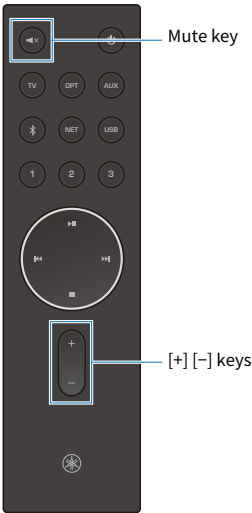


NOTE

When the product is off (standby), pressing any input source selection key on the remote control will automatically turn the power on.

Adjusting the volume

This section explains how to adjust the playback volume and mute the sound.



■ Adjusting the volume

Pressing the [+] key on the remote control increases the volume, and pressing the [-] key decreases the volume.

When the volume is adjusted, a numeric value between 0 and 100 appears on the information display of the front panel.

Volume (numeric display)



NOTE

- The volume can also be adjusted with the Volume knob on the front panel.
- You can also use the “MusicCast Controller” app to set the maximum volume limit and the initial volume level when the power is turned on.
- If a maximum volume limit is set, the volume cannot be set higher than that setting value. After the limit is reached, if you try to increase the volume further, “MAX” is displayed.

■ Muting the sound

Pressing the [■x] mute key on the remote control mutes the sound. Pressing it again returns the volume to its original level.

BASIC OPERATION > Adjusting the volume

When muted, the information display shows “MUTE”.

PLAYBACK

Listening to TV audio on this product

You can play audio from a TV connected to the [TV(eARC/ARC)] jack (HDMI) on this product.

Follow the steps below.

1 Turn on the TV.

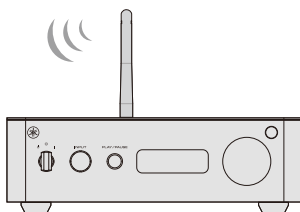

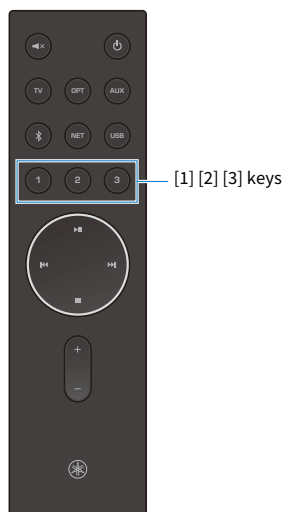

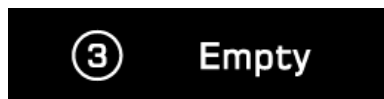

Initialization refers to the process of returning this product to its factory default settings. To initialize the product, perform the following steps.

- 1 Turn off (set to standby) the power of the product.**
- 2 Press and hold the [INITIALIZE] button on the rear panel for about 5 seconds.**

The [MusicCast] indicator blinks twice.



- 3 Turn on the power.**

This completes the initialization process.

■ Performing a force-reset

Forcing the product to restart is referred to as a force-reset. If the product becomes unresponsive for any reason, performing a force-reset may resolve the issue.

To perform a force-reset, use the following procedure.

- 1 Turn the power switch on the front panel counterclockwise to align it with the [⏻] mark and leave it there, and wait for about 10 seconds.**
- 2 Return the power switch to the center position.**
- 3 Turn on the power.**

Turn the power switch clockwise to align it with the [|] mark, and then return it to the center position, or press the [⏻] key on the remote control.

This completes the force-reset procedure.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Before assuming a malfunction

If you suspect a malfunction, check the following points first

- The power cords of this product, the connected audio devices (CD player, etc.), and the TV are securely connected to AC outlets.
- The power of this product, subwoofer, connected audio devices (CD player, etc.) and TV is turned on.
- All connection cables between devices are securely plugged into the jacks.

Problems with power, system, and/or remote control

Power fails to turn on

- **The protective circuit has been activated 3 times in a row.**

If the Power Indicator on the front panel of the product flashes when you try to turn the power on, the protective circuit has been activated, and so the power cannot be turned on. Please contact an authorized service center to have it repaired.

The power turns off suddenly

- **The protective circuit has activated (when the power indicator on the front panel flashes).**

After confirming that the power cord is properly connected, turn the power on again.

If the product repeatedly switches off, unplug the power cord from the AC outlet and contact an authorized service center.

- **The sleep timer activated.**

Turn the power back on and start playback. For more details, refer to the following.

- “Settings overview” (p.56)

- **The Auto Standby function was activated because the set period of time elapsed without operating the product.**

To disable the Auto Standby function, set “Auto Power Standby” to “Off”. For more details, refer to the following section.

- **The volume was increased too high, activating the protective circuit.**

Lower the volume.

The product does not respond to controls

- **The internal microcomputer is frozen due to an external electric shock (such as lightning or excessive static electricity) or to a drop in the power supply voltage.**

Unplug the power cord from the AC outlet, wait for at least 15 seconds, and then plug it in again. Then turn on the power.

If the issue persists, try performing a “force-reset”.

This product cannot be operated with the remote control

- **It is outside the operating range.**

Try using it within the operating range. For more details, refer to the following.

- **The batteries are dead.**

Replace with new batteries.

● **Because no operation was performed for a certain period of time, the information display has dimmed or turned off.**

Problems with the audio

No sound

● **There is a problem with the HDMI connection (for example, no sound from the TV connected via HDMI).**

● **A different input source is selected.**

No sound is output from the subwoofer

● **The subwoofer is not powered on, or is not connected properly.**

Turn on the power of the subwoofer. Also, check that it is connected properly.

- “Connecting a subwoofer” (p.21)

● **The volume of the subwoofer is extremely low.**

Adjust the volume on the subwoofer itself.

● **The auto-standby function of the subwoofer (for automatically turning the power off (standby)) was activated.**

Disable auto-standby or adjust its operating sensitivity on the subwoofer itself.

Sound is distorted

● **The volume is too loud.**

Lower the volume.

Audio drops out (when using a wireless network)

- **Electromagnetic waves from a microwave oven or other wireless devices are interfering with wireless communication.**

Turn those devices off, or move them away from this product and the wireless LAN router. Also, if your wireless LAN router supports the 5 GHz frequency band, switch the connection to the 5 GHz band.

Volume cannot be increased

- **The maximum volume is set too low.**

Use “Volume Settings” in the “MusicCast Controller” app to adjust the maximum volume level. For more details, refer to the following section.

The volume is too low (or too high) for a certain input source

- **There is a difference in volume level between input sources.**

Use “Input Level” in the “MusicCast Controller” app to adjust the volume for each input source individually.

Problems with TV connections (HDMI)

TV audio is not output from this product

- **The HDMI cable is not connected to an eARC or ARC-compatible HDMI jack of a TV.**
